2.40 Use of the Library

The library will serve all residents of the Richland Community Library District.

Because the library is a public space, all are welcome into the facility. Public use of space, including, but not limited to, studying/work space, public computers, copying/faxing/scanning services, public meeting space, and attendance at programs/events, are open to library members and non-members alike, provided that the Patron Code of Conduct is followed. See our Code of Conduct- Patron Behavior Policy (2.30) for details.

Library Membership

Library memberships (library cards) are needed to take out materials from the library.

There is no charge for membership for those residing within, or paying paying property taxes to, the District*. Proof of residency and/or ownership may be required upon registration and renewal of membership.

Persons living outside of the District, who have library memberships with qualified area libraries, may be entitled to reciprocal borrowing privileges. See our Circulation Policy (5.10) for details.

Persons living outside of the District, who qualify for our Educator membership, may be entitled to borrowing privileges. See our Educator Card Policy (5.12) for details.

Persons living outside of the District may purchase a membership card for \$75 per year for a family card.

All school entities within the District are eligible for library privileges.
