Robust Collections

- ★ Provide barrier-free access to resources for the community that are most in demand.

Thanks to Anne Richards, Collection Development Librarian, and help from patron staff members for planning, organizing, and launching the RCL Seed Library.
 - A patron recently borrowed our knitting machine from the Library of Things to make
 hats. We encourage patrons to share their photos with us to inspire others to explore new
 skills and projects through our collection.



Enriching Programs

- ★ Provide opportunities to create, learn, be entertained and come together.
 - Hosted a patron voting contest to name our library carts. Thanks to all

 hair.
 - We welcomed Michigan Notable Author Brittany Rogers. This event was funded by the Library of Michigan Foundation, Michigan Humanities Grant, and the Library of Michigan.
