- ★ Provide barrier free access to resources for the community that are most in demand.

- ★ Strive to encourage a lifelong love of reading by connecting community members to library collections and resources.

## **Broad Outreach**

- ★ Expand meaningful partnerships with local organizations to strengthen community inclusion.
  - <u>Sustainable Kitchen Series at RACC</u> (On a waitlist)
  - Food Waste Collection with Over the Moon Farm
  - Forage Walk at Kellogg Forest Park (On a waitlist)
  - Director visits Beacon Pointe monthly for library outreach
  - Mary Robertson, a member of the Patron Services staff, drops off and picks up RCL books from Gull Arbor Senior Living once a month.



- ★ Ensure sustainable funding sources for operating hours, collections, services, programs and staff.
  - RCL Survey sent out 1st week of June. Survey is open until July 8th
  - Received \$4,000 grant from RCL's Endowment Fund by way of Kalamazoo Foundation to replace the upstairs main printer
- ★ Create an inclusive and welcoming atmosphere with ample space for collections, programs, and community engagement.
  - Hosted Community Conversation at our library to hear input and ideas from patrons about the best use of the \$10,000 ALA Grant we were rewarded. RCL Director will apply for a Round 2 grant opportunity in Fall of 2024.

- 6,087 physical items and 1,359 digital items circulated for May 2024
